# Genetics in the 21<sup>st</sup> Century

Dr. Caryl Forristall, professor at the University of Redlands, will be the guest speaker at the January brunch. Dr. Forristall received her BS from Newton College in Massachusetts and her PhD from UC Berkeley in Genetics. She has done postdoctoral work on a NIH fellowship at University of Miami. Before coming to Redlands in 1994, she was a visiting professor at Mt Holyoke College.

Here at the University of Redlands she is full professor of biology teaching genetics, development biology, nutrition and first year biology. Her research in collaboration with Dr. Andres Collazo, House Ear Institute in LA, is on genetic control ear development in the frog Xenopus laevis. At the January brunch Dr. Forristall will cover the newest information emerging in genetic studies. Come join us for a very informative morning.

# Why Math? Why Science?

Is this a high school girl's question? Maybe not; if you're new to the Redlands Branch you may be wondering the same thing – why all this emphasis on the Math-Science Conference for Eighth Grade Girls?

A little bit of a background will soon get you enthusiastic about the concept. About twenty years ago the national AAUW conducted a survey across the United States that concluded that girls in public schools were being shortchanged in their opportunities to succeed by being intimidated by math and science classes for a variety of reasons: girls were considered less able to understand these classes, just not as smart as boys; girls had fewer role models in these fields; and, worst of all, girls were being ignored by their math and science teachers (yes, some women teachers too). This was a call to action for AAUW!

The Redlands Branch considered several options, but the first Conference in 1994 was so successful that it was continued for the next fifteen years. The emphasis on eighth graders is because that is a pivotal year when girls are making serious decisions about high school classes that may influence their future careers. With loyal cooperation among The University of Redlands, the Redlands and Yucaipa Unified School Districts, many women professionals, and local Branch organizers, the Conference has grown each year. March 3, 2010 will be the 16<sup>th</sup> Annual Math Science Conference for Eighth Grade Girls, hosting 600 students on the U of R campus. This is a Branch activity and every member should find some level of participation.

If you would like to be a part of this stimulating day, contact one of the cochairs, Lorie DeMarco or Sharon Pavlovich. If you are unable to be a participant, you may elect to be a sponsor (see sponsorship coupon in this issue). You will delight in the enthusiasm of these teen aged girls and you will admire the efforts of our guest presenters as they inspire, educate and encourage our young women.
