International Affairs

Almost every month we meet, not just to enjoy a delicious foreign meal and listen to such speakers at Carla Berlington, who in November told us of the horrors taking place today in Burma. Carla rescues boy and girl soldiers (5 years old and up) finds them a safe haven where they are fed, clothed, and comforted, while continuously under live fire.

But this group does even more; recently, we collected enough money to purchase from Heifer International a goat to be sent to an orphanage in Poland, which will give them milk, cheese, yogurt, protein and warmth from the hides.

To a small farm in Kosovo we were able to send 20 health chickens, providing them with food to stabilize the fight of hunger, and also an aid of a natural insect control. Last year, we were happy to send books and school supplies to an area in Kenya. And the year before that, we collected and boxed all kinds of goodies and sent them overseas to our soldiers.

Yes, we are definitely expanding our horizons as we roam this world seeking new knowledge. Come and join us.

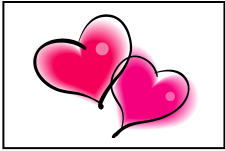
Reading and the Rainbow
