Women's History Month Celebration

AAUW in sponsorship with the Human Relations Commission of the City of Redlands and the Zonta Club of Redlands is proud to honor the month of March as Women's History Month. This month to honor women began on March 8, 1857 when garment workers in New York City staged one of the first organized protests by working women. In an effort to add women's history into curricula, a Women's History Week was initiated in 1978, and by 1981 became a national event. In 1987, the National Women's History Project petitioned Congress to include all of March as celebration of women.

To assist in our education of women's history, Dr. Jennifer Nelson, Assistant Professor of the Women's Studies program at the University of Redlands, will be our special guest speaker. Dr. Nelson graduated from Brown University in 1989 with a BA in Semiotics/Modern Culture and Media. After graduation she moved to New York City and became a high school teacher and a reproductive rights activist. In 1991 she started graduate school at Rutgers University. She earned her Ph.D. in United States history with a minor in women's history in 1999. Her book, *Women of Color and the Reproductive Rights Movement*, was published by NYU Press in 2003. Her most recent research is on African Americans and public health and on the Black Women's Health Movement. She has a forthcoming article in *The Bulletin of the History of Medicine* titled "Healthcare Reconsidered: Forging Community Wellness among African Americans in the South."

In addition, the City Council of Redlands will be presenting a proclamation of recognition of March as Women's History Month at 3 p.m. on the same day, March 6, 2007. All members are encouraged to attend one or both of these events.

Reading and the Rainbow

We will discuss *The Passion of Artemisia* by Susan Vreeland. Like her bestselling debut, *Girl in Hyacinth Blue*, Vreeland's second novel, *The Passion of Artemisia*, traces a particular painting through time: the post-Renaissance painter Artemisia Gentileschi's violent masterpiece, "Judith." The painting serves as a touchstone, foreshadowing Artemisia's rape the trial that followed; the early days of her hastily arranged marriage; and her eventual triumph as the first woman elected to the Accademia dell' Arte in Florence. Vreeland deftly works history and politics into the background, keeping her focus on Artemisia and her family. Vreeland's vision may be as close as we can come to understanding the anger and ambition that kept this talented woman at the doors of the Accademia, demanding entrance, in a time when respectable women rarely left their homes.
