Childhelp for the Prevention and Treatment of Child Abuse

Lynn Elder will speak on Childhelp at the April meeting. Childhelp began with two young Hollywood actresses' chance encounters – one with 11 homeless orphans abroad and one with Nancy Reagan – which led to a lifelong commitment to helping children in need. Childhelp celebrated its 50th anniversary last year, and owes its existence to the work of Yvonne Fedderson and Sara O'Meara. Their lifelong commitment to fighting child abuse has led to several nominations for the Nobel Peace Prize, as well as the founding of several residential facilities, a national toll-free child abuse hotline, as well as group and specialized foster care homes for the treatment of severely abused children. The story of their accomplishments is truly amazing.

Lynn Elder, will tell us about the Village of Childhelp West in Beaumont, which opened in 1978. Lynn is well equipped to speak on every facet of this amazing organization, as well as the Village. She has an AA degree in psychology from Cypress College and a bachelor's degree in social ecology from U.C. Irvine. She is presently on the board of the Western Regional Coordinating Council of Childhelp. She has worked at the Village for 25 years as a childcare worker, cottage supervisor, intake coordinator, volunteer coordinator, and is currently is the director of community relations.
