Member News

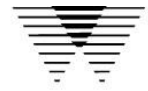
Sincere condolences are extended to Joanne Runkel and family upon the passing of her husband John, September 20th.

Seeking Donations: Used Inkjet Cartridges and Used Cell Phones

NOTE: When donating your used cell phone, it is important to first delete your personal data from the phone. This can be done by resetting your phone. A reset can erase the memory and restore the phone to its original factory condition. User manuals typically include directions for the process. Also, you can consult the Cell Phone Data Eraser, a free service. The website for this service, www.recellular.com, includes a link to downloadable instructions for erasing data from hundreds of cell phone models.
